



How to: Use Alerts

Osprey's Alerts provide users with access to the leading alerting system in the aviation industry, delivering proactive and pre-emptive rapid analysis and data on incidents, events, trends, patterns and emerging situations globally that indicate a risk to civil aviation or a change in the risk environment.

How to access Osprey Alerts in our system and use the dashboard

1. To access all Osprey Alerts (all clients have access to every Alert ever published) go to **Alerts** on the left-hand side
2. Search for the desired Alert by keyword (in the top left) or filter by severity and date

How to: Use Reports

Osprey's Reports provide instantaneous and dynamic risk assessment reports on any country, airport and airspace risk area globally.

How to view and generate country, airport or airspace Reports

1. Click the Reports option down the left-hand side of the page
2. Choose the risk type view using the tick box option or search for a country, airspace or airport (IATA/ ICAO codes), FIRs can also be overlaid
3. Click on a country to show the overview modal, providing activity in the last 6 months and the risk rating of that area
4. Click the Report button to generate an automatic, instant risk report of the selected area



Summary of risk rating

Level of risk: **EXTREME**

The presence of armed conflict within Libya coupled with heightened levels of crime, social unrest and aviation infrastructure deficits, pose logistical constraints to civilian flight operations within the country. In addition, the threat of militancy posed to aviation within Libya is highlighted by recent attacks against airports and aircraft inflight. Libya does not meet ICAO standards for safety and the security posture at airports in the country varies. Security personnel are unlikely trained to the highest international standards and staff responsible for safeguarding airport operations likely face difficulties in handling significant aviation-related safety or security events.

Note: All reports can be found in the 'Archive' section (under the reports tab) of the platform once run. However, a new report needs to be produced if you need to risk assess the same area again.





How to: Create your own Report Templates

Report Templates: Our Reports have a standard template to ensure you automatically have access to all the information we have on any particular country/airport or airspace, however, if you wish to alter the report to display different information depending on the audience, you can create your own templates.

How to create your own Report template

1. Go to **Reports > templates** option down the left-hand side of the page (you can also view/edit all your templates here)
2. Click on **add** to create a new template
3. Name the template
4. Choose the focus area (country, airspace or airport) and then
5. Choose the desired configuration from the tick box options
6. *Set the template as a default by selecting the default template tick box*
7. Click **save** (the template will now appear in the modal dropdown on the reports dashboard)
